Head Start Committee – Karen DeZarn (filled in for Shelley Worley) stated that the Committee reviewed the following items which were included in the Board packet:

Bill Schuman asked Ashley Johnson to explain how the number 2.28% came about. Ms. Johnson stated that the Office of Head Start annually does cost of living increases for Head Start. They keep it across the board to keep things fair. So whatever increase Head Start gets they also give to the rest of the agency. Tama Shaw added that we (HCCAA) are required by law to give every Head Start employee that percent. We will not get the money if it is not spent for cost of living increases. Bill Schuman then mentioned that the number was given by the Federal Government not HCCAA or the Board.

Roxanne Flores made a motion with a second by Frank Somera, Jr. to accept the Head Start Reports as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

This is due to staffing costs, not as much reimbursement for grants. Those are the centers that look worse on reports.

Frank Somera made a motion with a second by Anna Velez to approve the Senior Services Reports as presented. Motion passed unanimously.
